STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Grijalva will create and sustain a system of support to ensure that all students achieve success within a safe positive, caring environment. ANNUAL TITLE 1 MEETING

Each year a Title 1 Meeting will be held about the use of Title 1 funds staff and families will be invited to participate. ANNUAL EVALUATION

BUILDING PARENTAL CAPACITY

At Grijalva we build parental capacity in the following six ways as described in the National Network of Partnership Schools by leading investigator Dr. Joyce Epstein:

◇ PARENTING

In order to meet the needs of families, we will use the survey to help us determine the most convenient day, time, and location to offer parental workshops and adult education classes requested and suggested by staff. These will include English as a Second Language, Technology, and Parenting classes.

◇ Communication

Grijalva provides opportunities for parent-teacher conferences, sharing information and participating in their child's program, with timely staff response to academic suggestions and the parent/student compacts. We commit to communicate important information and updates to Grijalva families. Program activities, parental involvement opportunities, and meeting information are provided in a nondiscriminatory basis, and all notices, weekly/monthly newsletters and lunch menus will be sent in a language and form that parents can understand.



◇ DECISION MAKING

Parents at Grijalva will be advocates for parents through representation on school council, P.T.A and district parent organizations such as S.C.P.C.

◇ VOLUNTEERING

Parents are offered opportunities to be involved as volunteers and audience at school and in other locations to support students and school programs. A volunteer orientation meeting will be provided to include a description of volunteer responsibilities



◇ LEARNING AT HOME

We will offer parents academic workshops about how their children are learning reading, writing and math. We will also offer informative workshops as requested by Grijalva parents
